

A Panel Discussion was arranged involving Cricket Coaches, Players, Umpires and Administrators.

Sri Yere Goud & Sri Deepak Chowgule represented coaches, Sri Fazal Khaleel & Sri Shavir Tarapore represented Players, Sri Nandan & Sri K Srinath represented Cricket Umpires and Sri Santhosh Menon as Administrator. Sri Vedam Jaishankar moderated the discussion.

The topic started with Fielding teams using all tricks to deface the ball and indirectly tamper with, Coaches & Players agreed that it has become integral part of the fielding team's strategy to do it however, Umpires felt that they keep a strict vigil on this and not allow unfair practices.

There was a interesting discussion on Bowler opting for strange action including 360 degree turn around before the delivery. Umpires feel that as long as it is bowled legitimately and no change in guard it may be allowed but unfair tactics to gain will not be entertained. Coaches felt that they will encourage bowlers to experiment, Player panel is of the opinion that it is not new and as long as fair it can be allowed and are comfortable to face them. When Batsman is allowed switch hits at will, Bowlers are also entitled to experiment to fool Batsman.









Administrators expected the Game should be conducted sportingly well with in stipulated frame work of BCCI and no room for any dispute later.

Moderator Sri Vedam Jaishankar handled the session very well, controlled and balanced the thoughts.

Over all the discussion attracted full house attention and many of the senior Umpires present have also participated. It was well received by the Umpiring fraternity present on the occasion.

Cricket Law Quiz

Long Shot Tall Handle

Questions:

- 1. The fielding team took a new ballduring the 7th ball of the 92nd over. 7th ball was a No Ball and over was called after that. Minimum for new ball is 80 overs. When is the next new ball due?
- 2. Lunch is scheduled at 12 noon. At 11:59 AM when 3 ball of the over in progress remain to be bowled a batsman is hit and seeks medical attention. By the time he finished taking medical attention, it is 12:03 PM. Will you complete the over before taking lunch?
- 3. Last hour is scheduled from 3 PM to 4 PM. At 3:20 PM and innings ends when 7 overs have been bowled in the last hour. It starts raining at 3:28 PM and the rain stops at 3:34 PM. How many overs remain to be bowled in the last hour?
- 4. One ball remains to be bowled in the last over of the last hour of the

- match. The side batting last is 9 down with the scores level and with one batsman injured and unable to bat. What is the result of the match?
- 5. On day 1 of a 4 day match, after the call of play the first over has started but before the bowler could deliver the ball he twists his ankle and falls during his delivery stride. It starts raining and the day 1 was washed. How many runs are needed to enforce follow on Day 3 of the match?
- 6. 2 runs are needed to win and on the last ball of the match the bowler bowls a no ball of which the batsman is bowled and the ball runs away to the boundary without making any contact with the batsman's bat or person. What is the result of the match?
- 7. State if the following statement is correct or incorrect. "A batsman tries to loft a full toss which is called a No ball by the strikers end Umpire and in the process drops his bat on the wicket and is out Hit Wicket".
- 8. In the below scenario how many balls remain to be bowled in the over

- in progress. "On the 6th ball of the over in progress, a player who had gone out comes in without the Umpires permission and fields the ball at third man and throws it to the wicket keeper".
- 9. The batsmen at the wicket have completed the first run and have turned for the second. While running the second run the non striker slips and is sitting down near the 5 feet protected area marking. He is joined there by the striker who forgets to run and sits down exactly at the same position to enquire about the non striker. Soft Skills

Onside off the field (Column on soft skill and off field activities)

As we near the beginning of the new season, it's a good time to do things that help us prepare for it. This quarter we are going to have a look at Umpire fitness and its aspects. The game has evolved not just in its character in terms of speed but also in its form by the way it is covered on cameras which stress the need for aesthetic values to be exhibited apart from professional skills. Gone are the days of the voluptuous kind who have made way for the well-toned torsos standing upright chest open nodding in a near robotic manner to every question asked. Fitness is a focus area as it keeps one not only physically but also mentally fit. A positive body language is the need of the hour for anyone looking to make a mark in this profession. It is imperative to have a fitness schedule focusing on strength, form, endurance and overall grooming. One should have a routine focusing on aspects of fitness pre-season, season, pre match, during the match, postmatch. Basic cardio activity and some stretches is the least one can do to keep a bare minimum level of fitness. Core muscles and leg muscles are the key focus areas and one should prepare an exercise routine accordingly to work on the weaker sections of muscles and strengthening the muscles most used while performing the job. The most important thing here is exercise form, one should always have an arch in the back while standing and should not slouch. Iron man(plank), squats, lunges, calf raises, Russian twists, wall sitting, sit ups, and Sorenson holds are some of the exercises that one must programme their fitness regimen upon. Not to be forgotten is the need to walk or jog to ones comfort on a regular basis. Doing this will not only improve the ability to stand long hours but also mental focus and concentration. In all your exercise regimes never forget to warm up before and cool down after the session to prevent injuries and burn outs.
